On the occasion of Art Basel Paris 2024, artist Asuka Anastacia Ogawa presents new vignettes in the ongoing narrative of her signature, magical world. Guided by an interest in the forms of animism across the many cultural settings she has called home, this new set of paintings delves further into the typology of objects, animals, and rituals that the artist cites as capable of grounding the ethereal. Creatures and spirits command the gaze of both Ogawa's figures and their viewers. In other paintings, the artist's characters share intimate moments of devotional action wherein care is offered in equal part to a companion and the great beyond. These works, shown together, convey matters of the heart in the unique, dreamlike manner that only Ogawa can.

Asuka Anastacia Ogawa (b. 1988, Tokyo, Japan) spent much of her childhood in Tokyo, Japan. When she was three years old, Ogawa moved from this vertical urban backdrop to Brazil, where she passed a handful of formative early years amongst wandering farm animals and rushing waterfalls. As a teen, having attended high school partially in Sweden and partially in Tokyo, she moved to London to pursue her BFA from Central Saint Martins. After her first solo show at Henry Taylor's studio in Los Angeles, CA in 2017, she had a solo show at Blum & Poe, Tokyo in 2020, Blum & Poe, Los Angeles in 2021, Blum & Poe, New York in 2022, and Blum & Poe, Los Angeles in 2023. Her work is in the collection of the Dallas Museum of Art, Dallas, TX and the Nasher Museum of Art at Duke University, Durham NC. She is currently based in Los Angeles, CA.






