Peter BUGGENHOUT

Lives and works in Ghent.

Fischer's works create sequences of biomorphic, crystalline and fluid shapes. Each of her sculptures emerged through a multilayered process involving CAD drawings, computer-controlled laser cutting and hand modelling. In this way, Fischer highlights the properties of the material. Her sculptures are the result of a patient process of bending and folding Perspex plates and resemble images of frozen movements, both moving and still, fragile and unyielding.

She has exhibited her work in various places including, SCAD Museum of Art (USA), La Friche, Marseille (France), Haus am Waldsee, Berlin (Germany), Sara Hildén Art Museum(Finland) and ZKM (Germany).


GILBERT & GEORGE

Gilbert & George is an English-Italian artist duo consisting of Gilbert Prousch and George Passmore. Their career as an artist duo began in the late 1960s and continues today. Gilbert & George became known for performances and large photographic works behind glass. They pioneered performance art, video art and conceptuel art. The work rele ects what they consider to be moral factors, such as life and death or good and evil.



Jannins KOUNELLIS

b. Greece, 1936

Lived and worked in Rome, Italy.

Jannis Kounellis was born in 1936 in Piraeus, Greece. In 1956, Kounellis moved to Rome and enrolled in the Accademia di Belle Arti. While still a student, he had his rst stillo show, titled L'alfabeto di Kounellis, at the Galleria la Tartaruga, Rome, in 1960. The artist exhibited black-and-white canvases that demonstrated little painterliness; on their surfaces, he stenciled letters and numbers.

Kounellis has been honored with major exhibitions at Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam (1990); Museum Ludwig, Köln (1997); Neue Nationalgalerie, Berlin (2007); National Centre for Contemporary Art, Moscow (2011); and Today Art Museum, Beijing (201)1. His work has been included in iconic group exhibitions such as 'Op losse schroeven', Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam (1969); 'When attitudes become form', Kunsthalle, Bern (1969); and Documenta 5, Kassel (1972). Kounellis has participated in six Venice Bienniales (1976, 1978, 1980, 1984, 1988 and 1993).

His work is held in major institutional collections, including the Guggenheim, MOMA and Tate Modern. In recent years the artist has investigated architectural vocabulary, and his works appear increasingly sensitive to cultural, historical and site specificity.

Bertrand LAVIER

b. France, 1949

Lives and works in Paris, France.

Since the late 1960s, Lavier has reflected upon the relationship between painting and sculpture, representation and abstraction, life and art. An overriding characteristic of his work is its tongue in cheek attitude. In order to shape his ideas, Lavier developed a series of 'demonstrations': methods and strategies that enable him to question our intellectual baggage and to disrupt our most entrenched visual habits. His best-known intervention is to cover everyday objects with what he refers to as typical 'Van Gogh-brushwork'.


b. Germany, 1965

Her work evolves through her direct contact with nature, where she collects plant stalks, dandelion, ivy seeds and many other organic elements which she uses to construct sculptures resembling of everyday objects and architecture. By the use of horsehair, she crates shapes and webs that exit the bidimensional, invading the space. Her sculptures reveal the vital and plastic power of the ephemerality in nature. The softness and evanescence of her works revitalise the way of thinking about sculpture.

She exposed at the Museo Capodimonte, Naples (Italy), Taguchi Fine Art, Tokyo (Japan), Haus am Waldsee, Berlin (Germany), Tucci Russo Studio per l'Arte Contemporanea Chambres d'Art, Turin (Italy) and Kunsthaus Baselland, Basel (Belgium), to mention only the most recent. Richard LONG

Richard Long is considered a pioneer of the Land Art movement and one of the most prominent British artists. The core of Richard Long's artistic practice is walking in nature and the reflection that follows. His travels and wanderings in nature are an integral part of his work, life and philosophy. Since 1967, Long has been transforming his walks – from mountains to deserts, coasts, meadows, rivers and snow – into works of art, sculptures, photographs and texts. His work is both contemporary and "primitive, conceptual and natural, focusing on concern for both the finished work of art and the process of its completion".

He received the Praemium Imperiale prize 2009, the Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres in 1990 and the Turner Prize in 1989.

Lykiardopoulou's works are the results of her exploration of both her materials (clay, glazes, and pigments), and her subject matter, which she draws from the urban landscape and her personal life. 
MARTIN MARGIELA

Marisa Merz is one of the central figures in the historical movement of Arte Povera. Renowned for her use of unusual materials, such as copper wire, clay and wax, Merz creates sculptures and drawings reflecting a poetic sensitivity and gently vision of art and life. By employing abstract, organic figures, Merz creates familiar portraits and sculptures which insist on subjectiveness while emitting both a constantly changing message as well as the artist's belief that every shape is fluid and should be able to transform into any other shape.

She had received the Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement – 55th International Art Exhibition, La Biennale di Venezia (2013).

She was introduced to performance art and created a bridge between the aesthetics of minimalism and the language of body emotion. Her work intuitively explores the relationship between colour and surface, body and space. Though plainly representational, of common subjects she was allowed to experiment with new forms of abstraction, diverging from the largely minimalist and conceptual practices of her peers. Her subjects became pattern.

She won awards as the National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship Grant (1979), Cornell University Alumni Award(1998), and the Rolf Schock Prize (2003).







Robert WILSON

b. USA, 1941

Born in Waco, Texas, Wilson is among the world's foremost theater and visual artists. His works for the stage unconventionally integrate a wide variety of artistic media, including dance, movement, lighting, sculpture, music and text. His images are aesthetically striking and emotionally charged, and his productions have earned the acclaim of audiences and critics worldwide.

Major Wilson exhibitions have appeared at the Museum of Fine Arts, in 1991 (Boston); the Centre Georges Pompidou in 1991 (Paris); the Contemporary Arts Museum in 1991 (Houston); Minneapolis Institute of Art in 2018 (Minneapolis).

He contributed to multiple group exhibitions. In 2004 Robert Wilson started his Video Portraits, a series of HD video works on subjects that include celebrities such as Lady Gaga, Brad Pitt, Winona Ryder, Alan Cumming, Jeanne Moreau, Johnny Depp, Mikhail Baryshnikov, Renee Fleming, Sean Penn and Robert Downey Jr. as well as a variety of animals (the Snowy Owl, "KOOL", a black panther, a porcupine etc.). These works have been shown in more than 50 exhibitions worldwide, including at MoMa PS1, Paula Cooper Gallery and Bernier/Eliades Gallery Athens.
