Galleri Nicolai Wallner is thrilled to return to Art Basel Miami Beach, bringing an engaging presentation that bridges the contemporary Scandinavian art scene with the vibrant energy of Miami. Our selection highlights the innovative practices and distinctive voices within our gallery program, showcasing a dialogue between Copenhagen's artistic landscape and Miami's iconic setting.

This year's presentation features Jeppe Hein's unique balloon sculpture, which incorporates sand directly from Miami Beach, beautifully melding his playful exploration of form with a tangible sense of place. Also on view will be Cornelia Baltes' expansive grid of new paintings, where bright colors and dynamic compositions capture an expressive rhythm that mirrors the lively spirit of Miami. A Kassen contributes with a polished bronze sculpture, infusing traditional materials with a fresh, modern approach.

Other highlights include Alexander Tovborg's ethereal, mist-filled painting, evoking a sense of wonder,

and new works by Eva Helene Pade and J.G. Arvidsson, each capturing a compelling exploration of color and figuration. Daniel Buren's mirror installation will create interactive re lections, inviting viewers to engage with the work and their surroundings, while Anna Kristine Hvid Petersen's intimate, small-scale paintings add a subtle counterpoint of delicate detail. Rounding out the presentation, David Shrigley's striking pink grid adds a playful, thought-provoking element to the presentation.



In her latest grayscale pieces, Kinga Bartis conjures dark, enigmatic worlds populated by lively, otherworldly figures with wings. These figures, classic to Bartis' body of work, appear to both swim and fly—gliding effortlessly through ambiguous spaces that defy the boundaries of land, sea, and sky.

Bartis' approach to painting reaches beyond traditional techniques, embracing a multidisciplinary vision that resists definition and hierarchy. Rather than providing familiar markers to ground us, she disperses elements like stars, flora, and earthly symbols, encouraging viewers to let go of preconceptions. Her work invites an immersive experience, where human, animal, and natural forms merge and adapt, achieving a hybrid state that reflects a world in constant evolution.

The winged figures in these works embody Bartis' overarching themes of adaptability and transformation. Blurring lines between the recognizable and the surreal, they suggest a harmony with shifting realities and new ways of being. Through these richly textured, grayscale compositions, Bartis reveals a dynamic world where movement is fluid and forms evolve freely, offering a powerful meditation on resilience and openness to change.

In dante som dante alighieri, Alexander Tovborg presents a large-scale, misty vision that merges the personal with the mythic. Against a white, clouded backdrop, Tovborg delicately intertwines the likeness of his son Dante with that of the renowned poet Dante Alighieri. This subtle dual portrait blurs temporal and familial lines, linking father and son through a shared name and inviting reflections on legacy, identity, and imagination.

The ethereal quality of the painting, with its soft, mist-laden textures, evokes a dreamlike space where time and memory intermingle. Tovborg's depiction of his son as Alighieri resonates with themes of ancestry and influence, suggesting that identity is both inherited and individually defined. At once intimate and universal, dante som dante alighieri explores the profound ties that bind us to the past while capturing a sense of wonder at what lies ahead.


In Knælende, Eva Helene Pade captures a moment of profound vulnerability and connection. A central figure kneels before a gathering of nude forms, whose gender expressions flow fluidly, some figures distinctly defined, others less so. True to Pade's approach, the scene resonates with quiet intensity, exploring themes of intimacy, identity, and the complexities of human relationships.

Pade's work invites us into a timeless, ambiguous space, where the dynamics between individuals unfold in layers of subtle emotion. The figures in *Knælende*, expressive yet undefinable, reflect her vision of relationships as fluid, deeply personal, and open to interpretation. This evocative composition hints at both connection and self-discovery, embodying the quiet strength of vulnerability and the beauty of connection without boundaries.

J.G. Arvidsson's *Breakfast* captures a moment of quiet elegance and reflection, as a woman holds a service tray, poised between the intimate and the symbolic. The figure appears almost like a memory, a familiar yet distant presence, evoking the idea of service, care, or routine in a manner that feels both timeless and deeply personal. The warm yellow and orange tones of the background, classic to Arvidsson's palette, infuse the scene with a sense of calm warmth and nostalgia, drawing viewers into a space that feels both intimate and open to interpretation.

Arvidsson's work often presents figures in profile or silhouette, using these minimalist forms to invite personal reflection and interpretation. In *Breakfast*, the simplicity of the composition contrasts with the complexity of the emotions and stories it evokes. Through his layered techniqu painting on reclaimed wood, using oil sticks, and scraping away to reveal underlying textures - Arvidsson adds a tactile depth to the narrative. The physicality of his medium mirrors the emotional depth of his subjects, grounding the viewer in the quiet yet profound moment he has captured.

Rooted in personal themes, yet accessible to broader social and human reflections, Breakfast prompts the viewer to engage with the themes of memory, service, and identity, offering space for individual interpretation while evoking a collective sense of human experience.

Anna Kristine Hvid Petersen's new paintings continue her exploration of the sublime and the surreal, offering a window into an alternate reality that blurs the line between the familiar and the unknown. Through her meticulous technique, she transforms ordinary objects into compelling narratives that draw us in with their rich detail and subtle complexity. At first glance, her compositions might evoke traditional still life studies, but a closer look reveals a world where shadows defy logic, backgrounds deceive, and objects take on new and unexpected meanings.

In these new works, Hvid Petersen combines the familiar with the unfamiliar, introducing elements that both ground the viewer in the present while pulling them into a realm of imagination and mystery. The use of smaller formats in her paintings encourages intimacy, urging us to step closer and explore the intricate layers of her scenes. The tension between reality and abstraction in her work invites us to reconsider our relationship with the objects and spaces around us, challenging our perceptions and encouraging a deeper emotional engagement.

Relying purely on the chemical and physical reactions of natural elements, A Kassen's "Bronze Pour" series is created by pouring small amounts of hot, liquid bronze directly into the water. The bronze cools upon impact, creating small, unpredictable and unexpected shapes, which are scanned and cast on a larger scale in bronze.

The artists' hands are notably absent in the shaping of the works. They are necessarily abstract, yet they retain a referential quality to them as we instantly try and place them and find recognisable sources for their imagery. Reminiscent of modern sculptures, "Bronze Pour" retains a kind of biomorphic form that adds to this ambiguity.






























David Shrigley's latest piece presents a grid of nine drawings unified through a bold palette of reds and pinks, delving into the theme of anatomy with his signature blend of humor and insight. Arranged together, the drawings form a single body of work that feels both playful and reflective, each piece adding a layer to Shrigley's unique commentary on the human experience.

Shrigley's exploration of anatomy is both literal and metaphorical, offering simple yet striking images that reveal the quirks and intricacies of our physical form. The vibrant red and pink tones bring a visceral energy to the series, underscoring his work's characteristic balance of sarcasm and sincerity. Through his direct, almost childlike visual language, Shrigley invites us to confront the human body with curiosity and amusement, reminding us of our shared fragility and the humor in our own complexity.






















Daniel Buren's latest work brings his iconic striped motif to life in vivid orange and white, dynamically engaging the surrounding space through its interplay of color, line, and reflection. Mounted directly on the wall, the work adapts to the height of its setting, creating an impactful presence that transforms with the space.

The alternating bands of orange and white create a visual rhythm that draws the viewer's gaze, while mirrored surfaces within the composition reflect and refract the environment. This elegant construction gives the illusion of the work extending beyond its physical frame, inviting viewers into a layered experience of shifting perspectives. As light, movement, and surroundings interact with the piece, each encounter offers a fresh sense of discovery, making Buren's work both immersive and infinitely intriguing.

Jeppe Hein's latest work features a series of coloured mirrored balloons, tied to the ground with sand directly sourced from Miami Beach. This tactile connection between the balloons and the earth creates a dynamic contrast, where the vibrant, reflective surfaces of the balloons interact with the natural environment. The sand anchors the balloons, grounding them while inviting the viewer to consider the play between the ephemeral and the permanent.

Much like Hein's earlier works, these balloons create a distorted, fish-eye view of their surroundings, warping space with their rounded, reflective surfaces. The lightness of the balloons, tethered by the weight of the sand, evokes a sense of tension — a playful balance between the urge to float freely and the gravity that keeps them in place. The work transforms the space, offering viewers an ever-changing perspective of the environment, drawn through the interplay of reflection, light, and material.
