



For this year's edition of Meridians at Art Basel Miami Beach, Galerie Thomas Schulte presents a new, large-scale sculpture by American sculptor Alice Aycock, entitled *Goya Twister*.


This 15 foot (4,50 meter) tall work is the latest in her *Turbulence* series, first shown in 2014 in a spectacular installation on Park Avenue in New York City. Over the years, this series has grown, with each *Twister* variation dealing with complex compositions of white ribbons in a multitude of diverse forms.

The title *Goya Twister* references the dramatic turbulence found in the Spanish painter's engravings. The eccentric ensemble of dynamically swirling spirals of this large-scale sculpture recalls anthropomorphic postures, creating a different impression from each angle.





Much of my work has been a meditation on the philosophical ramifications of technology from the simplest tool (the arrowhead and the plow) to the computer. Alice Aycock (born 1946, Harrisburg, PA, USA) must be counted among America's preeminent contemporary sculptors with a world wide reputation.

After early successes with important contributions to Land Art, she first gained international recognition in 1977 with her contribution to documenta 6 and a solo project at MoMA, New York, in the same year, and numerous one person shows in institutions in the USA and Europe in the following years including the MCA Chicago, the Haags Gemeentemuseum, Netherlands, and the Serpentine Gallery, London, and inclusions in the Venice Biennale, the Whitney Biennial and many more.

Alice Aycock's works can be found in collections such as MoMA, the Whitney Museum of American Art, the Metropolitan Museum, the Walker Art Center, LACMA, the National Gallery of Art, Washington D.C., the Philadelphia Museum as well as many European collections including Museum Ludwig, Cologne, Sprengel Museum, Hannover, or the Louis Vuitton Foundation and many others.

PARK AVENUE, PAPER CHASE, 2014

In March 2014, Alice Aycock installed six large, elaborate sculptures on the meridian of Park Avenue in New York City between 52nd and 57th Street. A seventh work was installed at Park and 66th Street in front of the Park Avenue Armory during the same period of almost five months overall. These works, made from aluminum and fiberglass, ranged in size from 12 to 27 feet in height (3.7 to 8.2 meters) and from 18 to 70 feet in length (5.5 to 21.3 meters). Much of Aycock's previous work, in both the public and private spheres, has incorporated images of wheels and turbines and references to energy in the form of spirals, whirlwinds, whirlpools, spinning tops, or whirly-gigs. For the Park Avenue Paper Chase project in spring 2014, Aycock aimed at visualizing the movement of wind energy as it flows up and down the avenue, creating random whirlpools, touching down here and there, and sometimes forming a dynamic threedimensional massing of forms. The sculptural assemblages suggest waves, wind turbulence, turbines, and vortexes of energy. One of the works, in particular, references the expressive quality of wind through drapery and the chaotic beauty of fluid, or flow, dynamics. Aycock intended the work to have a random, haphazard quality—in some cases, piling up on itself, and in others, spinning off into the air. The visualized energy corresponds to the nature of the city of New York, correlating to the energy of thought and ideas colliding and being transmitted outward. Aycock's works can therefore be interpreted as the metaphorical visual residue of the energy of Manhattan. The sculptures also reference the practice of making cutout paper models of visual ideas in architecture and sculpture, a technique that dates back to Russian Constructivism. Several works from the project were later lent to sculpture exhibitions, including the sculpture biennale Blickachsen in Bad Homburg, Germany;

the LongHouse Reserve in East Hampton; Lake Shore Park in Chicago; and the annual sculpture exhibition at Chatsworth House in England. Furthermore, several works related to the project have been installed in public locations since, including the IQHQ, RaDD, San Diego, California; Des Moines International Airport, Des Moines, Iowa; the McNay Art Museum, San Antonio, Texas; and more.
