
VERONIKA PAUSOVA








MARGAUX WILLIAMSON





AZZA EL SIDDIQUE








SHAAN SYED






Jeremy Shaw (b. 1977, North Vancouver, BC) lives and works in Berlin, Germany. Shaw's recent presentations include the Hamburger Bahnhof (Berlin), Deichtorhallen (Hamburg), Centre Pompidou (Paris), MoMA PS1 (New York), Schinkel Pavillon (Berlin), MOCA (Toronto) and MAC (Montreal), and he has been featured in international surveys such as the 57th Venice Biennale, 16th Lyon Biennale and Manifesta 11, Zurich. In 2016 he was awarded the Sobey Art Award and was artist-in-residence at the Hammer Museum, Los Angeles in 2018. STEPHANIE TEMMA HIER



Born in Regina, Saskatchewan in 1977, Jessica Eaton currently lives and works in Montreal. She received her bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the Emily Carr University of Art + Design in Vancouver. Solo exhibitions have been presented at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Cleveland, the California Museum of Photography (Riverside), and The Photographers' Gallery (London). Eaton has been featured in numerous group exhibitions, including at the Foam Fotografiemuseum (Amsterdam), the Cleveland Museum of Art's Transformer Station, the Museum of Fine Arts in St. Petersburg, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal, the Daegu Photography Biennale (South Korea), and Presentation House Gallery (Vancouver). Eaton's work can be found in the public collections of the National Gallery of Canada and the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal (Canada), among others. In 2016, she was nominated for the prestigious Sobey Art Award, and in 2015, she was selected by the Capture Photography Festival to create a major public art commission for the city of Vancouver. 





JANET WERNER


Janet Werner (b. 1959, Winnipeg, Manitoba) lives and works in Montreal, Canada, and holds an MFA from Yale University (New Haven). Werner's work has been exhibited extensively across Canada, in the US and Europe. Notable exhibitions include the Musée d'art contemporain de Montreal, Bradley Ertaskiran (Montreal), Almine Rech (Brussels), Kasmin Gallery (New York), Arsenal Contemporary Art (New York), Anat Ebgi (Los Angeles), the Art Gallery of Guelph (Guelph), and Whatiftheworld Gallery (Cape Town). A survey exhibition entitled Another Perfect Day, organized by the Kenderdine Art Gallery, was presented in five locations across Canada, including the Esker Foundation (Calgary). SUZY LAKE

Suzy Lake (b. 1947; Detroit) is an American-Canadian artist based in Toronto, Canada. Lake's work has been presented extensively across Canada and internationally at the Centre Pompidou-Metz (Metz), Museum of Modern Art (New York), Metropolitan Museum of Art (New York), National Gallery of Canada (Ottawa), Brandhorst Museum (Munich), Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, Vancouver Art Gallery, Hayward Gallery (London), Santa Monica Museum of Art, Los Angeles Museum of Contemporary Art, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal, and the Art Gallery of Windsor. In 2014, the Art Gallery of Ontario presented a retrospective spanning Lake's career. Her works have also been featured in several historic feminist exhibitions including WACK! Art and the Feminist Revolution (curated by Connie Butler, touring 2007–2008) and WOMAN: The Feminist Avant-Garde of the 1970s, Works from the Sammlung Verbund, Vienna (touring 2013–18) and are part of major private and public collections worldwide. A member of the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts, Lake was the recipient of the 2016 Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts, and the Scotiabank Photography Award. In 2024, she was presented with the Distinguished Artist Award for Lifetime Achievement by the College Arts Association in Chicago, Illinois.
