

### KETUTA ALEXI-MESKHISHVILI



For Frieze Seoul, 2024 LC Queisser presents new works by Ketuta Alexi-Meskhishvili. It's Ketuta Alexi-Meskhsihvili first presentation in South Korea.

Ketuta Alexi-Meskhishvili (b. 1979, Tbilisi, Georgia) lives and works in Berlin, Germany. Experimenting with various photographic techniques and modes of iconographic representation, her primary tools become digital and analog, "camera-less" photography and film, and mixed media installations, such as sheer curtains with enlarged prints or frontal sculptures. Diverging from her analogue beginnings, Alexi-Meskhishvili negotiates the precision of capturing perceived reality through exposure, trace-making, and blurring of the negative, as well as manipulating the image in its scanning and post-production stages. True or printed vegetation, latex prosthetics, ornaments on souvenir bags, street views, and intimate portraits often compose her uncanny imagery. Material interventions and digital photomontage of collaged symbolistic compositions lead her subject matter to reveal visceral sentiment through abstraction and speculative narration.

Ketuta Alexi-Meskhishvili (b. 1979, Tbilisi, Georgia) lives and works in Berlin, Germany. ### THEA GVETADZE



For Frieze Seoul, 2024 LC Queisser presents new paintings Thea Gvetadze.

Thea Gvetadze (b. 1971, Riga, Latvia) works and lives in Tbilisi, Georgia. Embracing no longer practiced traditional techniques in clay, mosaics, and textile, the artist has long worked between mediums, creating evocative paintings, textural wall pieces, emblematic reliefs, and mosaics that arrange in holistic installations. She often confronts the white cube with clay-smeared walls holding autonomous pieces loaded with emotional tension and enigmatic dimension. Stemmed from drawing practice, her large-scale figurative paintings on raw black velvet carefully render autobiographical and folkloric narratives interwoven with historical and vernacular references. Gvetadze's animistic oeuvre, distinguishable by the inviolable use of texture and negative space, manages to monumentalize individuals, animals, plants, and inanimate objects, drawn from the artist's personal, often serendipitous encounters and bucolic explorations of local rural areas.

Her recent solo exhibitions include 'Room for many' (with Diana Tamane), Art House Tartu, Tartu (2024); Iris Iberica, LC Queisser (2022); Subtropical Ushguli, LC Queisser, Tbilisi (2019); Thea Gvetadze — Becoming Thea Merlani, Museum of Contemporary Art, Antwerp (2018); Zeda Tsinsvla, Gallery Nectar, Tbilisi (2017). In addition, her work has been included in group exhibitions at Galeria Stereo, Warsaw (2024); Efremidis Gallery, Berlin; LC Queisser, Tbilisi; JAN KAPS, Cologne (2023); GNM — Dimitri Shevardnadze National Gallery, Tbilisi; M HKA, Antwerp (2022); SUPRAINFINIT Gallery, Bucharest; 4710 Gallery, Tbilisi (2021); Literature Museum, Tbilisi; Architecture Biennial, Tbilisi (2018); etc.

### SER SERPAS



For Frieze Seoul, 2024 LC Queisser presents new paintings by Ser Serpas.

Ser Serpas (b. 1995, Los Angeles, California, USA) works and lives in New York, USA. Known for her large-scale installations of precariously arranging urban discard into artworks, Serpas works between installation, sculpture, painting, performance, poetry, and sound. Transcending various mediums, her work maintains the awareness of physicality, fragmentation, fixture, and gravity. Serpas employs the body motif in her oil paintings executed on large unstretched canvases. In her new works presented at the booth she depicts bodies generated by artificial intelligence. The figures represented are improbable, almost unrecognisable contortions of limbs and torsos, often headless. The paintings refuse the conventions of the figure, Serpas draws out another body: interstitial, contingent, and structured by disorder.

Ser Serpas works are included in the exhibition 'Portrait of a Collection' selected works from the Pinault Collection at SONGEUN, Seoul, opening on September 4.

Ser Serpas (b. 1995, Los Angeles, California, USA) works and lives in New York, USA.
