






Haley Josephs Heart Song, 2024 Oil on wood panel 22 x 10 inches \$12,500



## Haley Josephs

In Haley Josephs paintings, humans and animals are seen moving through dream-like compositions. The central feminine characters take inspiration from the artist's late aunt and sister, embodying archetypes that are portrayed as lonesome wanderers, on the perpetual pathway of life and its endless journeys. The departed feminine figures straddle two worlds: one foot in our lived reality and the other in what lies beyond. These women and children are often depicted in naturalistic settings; the weather, sometimes foreboding, other times bright, reflects the emotional landscape of the characters. Touching on themes of death and rebirth through personal narrative, these wanderers seem to possess an inner strength and are met with a realization of their ability to overcome and rise above. The work possesses a primordial dream-like quality, in which the characters have the space to explore their inner strength while addressing life's cosmic unknowns.

Haley Josephs (b. 1987 Seattle, Washington) received her BFA in Painting & Drawing from Tyler School of Art at Temple University in 2011, and her MFA in Painting & Printmaking from Yale University in 2014. Recent solo shows include Out of my Mind at Jack Barrett (2024), Every Part of the Dream at Almine Rech, London (2022), and Passages at Jack Barrett (2022). Recent international group exhibitions include the Cleveland Institute of Art, Ohio; Almine Rech, London; Unclebrother & Gavin Brown Enterprise, Hancock, NY; and Capsule, Shanghai, China.

## Ben Tong

Ben Tong (b. 1981 Toronto, Canada) is an artist based in Los Angeles, California. His work has been exhibited at Night Gallery, Los Angeles; Bradley Ertaskiran, Montreal; University of California, Santa Barbara; Commonwealth and Council, Los Angeles; K11 Art Foundation, Hong Kong; Art Basel Film program, Hong Kong; Europa NYC, New York; Island, New York. He was a fellow at the Villa Aurora Foundation, Berlin, and in residency at the Soma Summer Pro-gram, Mexico City. Tong received a BCS in Computer Science from the University of Toronto, a BFA in Photo from CalArts, and an MFA in Art from CalArts.

Born in 1981 in Toronto, Canada, and now based in Los Angeles, artist Ben Tong has worked with an array of media, from video to installation, and paint ing. His oil paintings on canvas move beyond tradi tional representation, mining the fertile ground between a moment and its later re-remembrance. The objects in the compositions, in sumptuous colors ranging from deep violets to apricot, feel like approximations drawn from a dreamlike state. Tong often foregoes a brush in favor of rags and a mas sage gun, bruising the color onto the painting's surface, some-times rendering dappled semblances of a still-life. Here, Tong freezes memory on the brink of vanishing and edges closer to a mon-ument of the in-betweens of daily life.
