




Caro Deschênes Pearl, Whelk, Feather, 2024 Oil on canvas 48 x 30 inches \$10,500





Esther Sibiude is a visual artist and harpist living in New York City. Originally from France, she studied philosophy at la Sorbonne in Paris before moving to Berlin to study Fine Arts at the Universität der Künste. In complement to her visual art practice, Sibiude writes music and poetry. Storytelling acts as the foundation for her visual practice, in which she creates drawings that represent fictionalized origin stories and fluctuate between cosmic landscapes and microscopic biologies. Her work has been included in solo and group exhibitions at Entrance Gallery, New York, NY; Shoot the Lobster, New York, NY; and Lomex Gallery, New York, NY.

Recent performances that she wrote and directed include The Song of Dirt Stammers our Tongue, a live staged radio operetta performed at the Kitchen, Esra, a live staged radio play performed in the panorama of NYC at the Queens Museum, as well as performances at David Zwirner, New York, NY; 47 Canal, New York, NY; and Derosia, New York, NY.
