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David Peter Francis is pleased to announce a three-person presentation of works by **R. Jamin** (b. Los Angeles, CA), **Lucas Odahara** (b. 1989, São Paulo, Brazil) and **Gonzalo Reyes Rodriguez** (b. 1987, Mexico City, Mexico). These artists, who have never previously been shown in an art fair context, represent the gallery's ongoing commitment to category-defying voices.

Across their respective multimedia practices, all three find simultaneous interest in alternative histories, myth-making, and modes of representational storytelling. R. Jamin's drawing practice situates itself as an examiner of the iconographic and a visualizer of the unknowable. Often with references lacking a recorded visual language, Jamin's graphite drawings synthesize and envision conceptions of infinity, foraying into the transcendental and divine.

Similarly, Gonzalo Reyes Rodriguez's most recent body of work mines various visual and photographic archives—these photos offer windows into histories, ones that Reyes Rodriguez simultaneously editorializes and obfuscates in subsequent compositions. The resulting vanitas-style images interrogate what it means to represent, allowing the viewer to surmise narratives and draw connections across time and space.

While Reyes Rodriguez and Jamin both have interest in representational imagery, Lucas Odahara pushes back against it via abstraction— his *Under the Impression* series observes how events can imprint upon our own personal histories. Using the word "impression" as a conceptual center, Odahara embosses paper and steel with different objects to create structures that are imbued with traces of the ephemeral. These mimic how we function in our day to day lives— our memory becomes an assemblage of everything that we've touched, and what's been left behind in their wake.

Taken together, Jamin, Odahara, and Reyes Rodriguez present a new vision regarding means of representation and the many forms it can take. United by a penchant for the fleeting and the ephemeral, they transcribe a past that wasn't previously visible, and a future that is of our own making.

R. Jamin (b. Los Angeles) lives and works in Los Angeles, CA.


Lucas Odahara (b. 1989, São Paulo) is an artist based in Berlin, working with a variety of media including ceramic glaze painting, public installation, collage and writing. In 2022, he was awarded with the Berlin Art Prize and in 2024 he was a resident at the Jan van Eyck Academy in the Netherlands. His work has been seen at many exhibitions, including: Neue Berliner Kunsverein (n.b.k.), Berlin (2024); David Peter Francis, New York (2024); Künstlerhaus Bethanien, Berlin (2023); TaxisPalais Kunsthalle Tirol, Austria (2023); Kleinplastik Triennial Fellbach (2022); OPENART Biennial, Sweden (2022); Cultural Center of Belgrade (2022); Berlinische Galerie (2021); Bärenzwinger, Berlin (2021); Kunstverein Grafschaft Bentheim (2020); Indus Valley School of Art and Architecture, Karachi, Pakistan (2019); Schwules Museum, Berlin (2017); Kunsthal Charlottenborg, Copenhagen (2016); Weserburg Bremen (2015) and Künstlerhaus Bremen (2015).

Gonzalo Reyes Rodriguez (b. 1987, Mexico City) received his BFA from School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2009, and his MFA from University of Pennsylvania in 2016. He attended the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture in 2019. Prior to his solo exhibition at David Peter Francis, Reyes Rodriguez has presented solo projects at Blinkers, Winnipeg; Terremoto/ La Postal, Mexico City; The Arts Club of Chicago, Chicago; and The Windor Contemporaneo, Madrid. He participated in the 2023 edition of Bienal Sur-International Biennial of Contemporary Art of the South, as well as had his work included in exhibitions at Luhring Augustine, New York; National Gallery of Art, Ottawa; Centre for Contemporary Art, Glasgow; Marinaro, New York; Winnipeg Art Gallery, Winnipeg; North Miami Museum of Contemporary Art, Miami; and Bemis Center for Contemporary Art, Omaha; amongst others. He is the recipient of the 2023 Scotiabank New Generation Photography Award. Reyes Rodriguez lives and works in Vancouver, Canada.






